

As the holiday season begins, SEEDS (Sustainable Energy Education and Development Support) wants to thank you for caring about sustainability in our communities, and for helping SEEDS grow! There is much good news to share, and your support has made it possible! So here it is... your annual SEEDS update/fundraising letter. This is the **only request for donations** we mail each year. Please consider making a tax —deductible donation today to help continue our good work in the community.

This year there is a great opportunity to have your gift matched (essentially doubled) if you donate by December 31, 2015. A donor has offered to match all donations up to \$4,000! This is great news for all of us!

Founded 7 years ago, SEEDS has been promoting energy efficiency, renewable energy and sustainable living to improve the health of our environment and local economy. Some important milestones:

- In 2009, SEEDS sponsored training in solar and small scale wind so our area contractors had an opportunity to benefit from the growing demand for renewable energy, resulting in two new local solar installation companies.
- In 2010, we developed a home energy assessment program to help residents save energy. Since then this program has provided 21 summer jobs for area high school students, assessed 227 homes, and is saving an estimated 150,000 kilowatt hours annually that's thousands of dollars area families are saving each year!
- In 2011, we launched Wayne Businesses Conserve, and continue to help businesses save energy costs.
- In 2012, SEEDS worked with the Chamber of Commerce adding a *Green Business Award* annually to honor businesses dedicated to people, profit and planet.
- In 2013, we hired our first (part-time) Executive Director.
- In 2014, SEEDS partnered with Habitat for Humanity of Wayne County and installed the first solar system on a Habitat home in PA!

And this year, SEEDS will perform 6 energy efficiency upgrades on non-profit buildings in our area, so they can better serve our region by saving energy costs! This program was funded by the John and Helen Villaume Foundation and The Overlook Estate Foundation Inc. The non-profit winners are: Dessin Animal Shelter, Wayne County Historical Society, Lacawac Sanctuary, the Waverly Community House and the Hawley and Northern Wayne Public Library branches.

Exciting plans for 2016 include:

- More free educational forums
- Expanding our free energy assessment program to include helping more non-profits
- Partnering with two more Habitat for Humanity organizations
- Partnering with The Sustainability Fund (thesef.org)
- Customizing solar energy and energy efficiency forums for Wayne/Pike builders
